- III. Review/approval of Council Minutes: Council member Ruble made a motion to approve the August 21, 2023 council minutes, second by council member Brooke. Motion passes with a 6-0 voice vote.

ORDINANCE 2023-06: AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE REGISTRATION OF NON-OWNER-OCCUPIED SHORT-TERM RENTALS FACILITIES WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF WARD, PROVIDING FOR PERMIT REQUIREMENTS, RULES FOR OPERATING A SHORT-TERM RENTAL, AND FOR PENALTIES AND FINES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES. (SECOND READING) was read by title only by City Clerk Rummel. After discussion, council member Ruble made a motion to table O-2023-06 to next month's agenda, seconded by council member Hall. Motion passes with a 6-0 voice vote.

Roll call: Brooke-no, Ruble-yes, Hall-yes, Chapman-yes, McMinn-no, Hefner-no. Mayor Gastineau voted in the affirmative to break the tie. Motion passes with a 4-3 vote.

ORDINANCE 2023-20: AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A TEMPORARY RECREATIONAL VEHICLE (RV) AND CAMPING AREA WITHIN THE CITY OF WARD SPORTS COMPLEX; TO ESTABLISH PERMITTING AND RESERVATION PROCESS; TO ESTABLISH A FEE STRUCTURE; WAIVING THE PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE 2009-01; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES was read by title only by City Clerk Rummel. Roll call: McMinn-yes, Hefner-no, Brooke-no, Ruble-yes, Hall-yes, Chapman-yes. Motion passes with a 4-2 vote.
