## Council Meeting Minutes March 28, 2023 at 6:30 PM

- Call to Order: by Mayor Gastineau @ 6:30pm. Prayer was offered by Steven Hall followed by the pledge of allegiance.
- II. <u>Roll Call:</u> by City Clerk Rummel. Hall-present, Chapman-present, Harbort –resigned, Hefner –present, Brooke-present, Ruble- present. We have a quorum.
- III. Review/approval of Council Minutes: Council member Ruble made a motion to approve the February 20, 2023 council minutes, second by council member Chapman. Discussion. Motion passes with a 5-0 voice vote.
- IV. <u>Department Reports and Financials:</u> Council member Chapman made a motion to approve the department reports and financials, second by council member Ruble. Motion passes with a 5-0 voice vote.
- V. <u>Planning Commission Report</u>:
   The Planning Commission did not meet last month, so there is no report.
- VI. Special Guest Speaker: Dr. Tony Thurman, Cabot Public School Superintendent

  Dr. Tony Thurman presented the millage change and bond restructure. Some of these changes affect pre-K services and improvements to the athletic department. If approved, a new Pre-K school will be built just off the Austin exit and will have a Safe Room that will be available to local residents including Ward.

### VII. <u>Unfinished Business:</u>

A. ORDINANCE O-2023-02: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY OF WARD ORDINANCE 2014-07, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES (2<sup>ND</sup> READING)

Mayor Gastineau handed the council members a letter from city attorney Chris Lacy's office. The letter was a response to a complaint sent to the attorney general regarding reconnect fees. See attachment. He explained this would streamline the billing process to be in line with surrounding areas. Also, it would reduce reconnection costs for citizens. Council member Hefner made a motion to approve O-2023-07 on its second reading, seconded by council member Ruble.

C. ORDINANCE 0-2023-05: AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT CREATING LRAFB REGIONAL PLANNING COMMITTEE; IDENTIFYING CITY OF WARD OFFICIALS TO THE COMMITTEE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES (1<sup>ST</sup> READING)

Discussion. Council member Ruble made a motion put O-2023-05 on its first reading, seconded by council member Hall. Roll call: Ruble – yes, Hall-yes, Chapman-yes, Hefner-yes, Brooke-yes. Motion passed its first reading. Council member Ruble made a motion to suspend the rules and put O-2023-05 on its 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> reading, seconded by council member Chapman. Motion passes with a 5-0 voice vote. Council member Hall made a motion to approve O-2023-05, seconded by Council member Ruble. Roll call: Hall-yes, Chapman-yes, Hefner-yes, Brooke-yes, Ruble-yes. Motion passes with a 5-0 roll call vote.

D. ORDINANCE O-2023-06: AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE REGISTRATION OF NON- OWNER-OCCUPIED SHORT-TERM RENTALS FACILITIES WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF WARD, DELCARING AN EMERGENCY, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES (1<sup>ST</sup> READING)

Discussion. This ordinance was withdrawn by Mayor Gastineau will be placed on the agenda next month. Council member Ruble made a motion to table to next month, seconded by council member Hall. Motion passes with a 5-0 voice vote.

Discussion of the top four architect firms. Council member Hefner made a motion to R-2023-07, seconded by council member Chapman. Roll call: Chapman-yes, Hefner-yes, Brooke-yes, Ruble-yes, Hall-yes. Motion passes with a 5-0 vote.
